

## RECRUITMENT ADVERTISEMENT

Are you a healthy woman who uses tampons? And would you like to participate in a clinical research study on a new feminine hygiene product?

The Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson Medical School is conducting a study that will determine the placement and shape of a new menstrual protection product. Similar to a tampon, this new product is inserted into the body with an applicator, but has an alternate design to collect menstrual fluid. Our clinicians plan to determine the position and fluid collection of this new product by abdominal ultrasound. *You should not be menstruating at the time of the study.* You may be eligible to be in this study if you are:

- 18-45 years of age
- Regular plastic applicator tampon user
- No prior history of pelvic reconstructive surgery and active infection
- Have regular menstrual cycles

There is one clinic visit that will last approximately 1&1/2 to 2 hours. Qualified subjects will receive study-related care at no charge. Compensation for study-related time and travel will be provided to those who complete the study.
