



## **Hanin Rashid, Ph.D.**

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Hanin Rashid, Ph.D., is an Instructor in the Department of Psychiatry and a faculty member in the Cognitive Skills Program at Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson Medical School (RWJMS). She completed her undergraduate and post-baccalaureate education at Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey earning her undergraduate degree in Psychology with honors. She also earned a Master of Education degree in Learning, Cognition, and development, and a Ph.D. in Educational Psychology with a certificate in Higher Education Leadership.

She provides individual consultation to medical and graduate students to enhance efficiency and effectiveness of study and test taking strategies tailored to individual needs and integrated with coursework.
