Dr. Schein is an Adjunct Assistant Professor in the Department of Pharmacology at Rutgers - Robert Wood Johnson Medical School. She received her Bachelor's Degree from the University of Rochester, Rochester, NY. Her Master's Degree and Ph.D. were conferred as a joint degree between Rutgers University and the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey - Robert Wood Johnson Medical School. Her Post-doctoral training was in the Center for Agricultural Molecular Biology, Rutgers University, Cook College, New Brunswick, NJ.

Dr. Schein has many years of medical education experience.
