
























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




Our Mission

- ➤ We are HIPHOP-Promise Clinic, a student-run free clinic that aims to provide free primary care to the uninsured clients of Elijah's Promise Community Kitchen in New Brunswick, NJ.
- We are a community of medical students, volunteer faculty physicians, and local partners dedicated to providing patient-centered, quality primary care services.
- ➤ We are a source of accessible healthcare for our patients and a place for student-doctors to learn from and give back to the local community.

What We Do:

- ➤ EDUCATION AND EMPOWERMENT of clients of Elijah's Promise Community Kitchen to lead healthier lives through health literacy initiatives
- COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT through service-learning aimed at teaching future physicians the importance of continuity of care, teamwork, advocacy, innovation, and leadership
- PATIENT AND PEER EDUCATION through collaborative learning and exchange between students at different stages of their medical school education

Our Model:

- Continuity of Care
 - ➤ Each new patient at HIPHOP-Promise Clinic is paired with a team of medical students. Under the direct supervision of volunteer clinical faculty from Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson Medical School, student-doctor teams are responsible for their assigned patient's care throughout their time in medical school, ensuring continuity.
- Team-Based Care
 - Students of medicine, pharmacy, and social work team up to provide holistic care for their patients.

It has been over 15 years since a free, all-inclusive primary care student-run clinic began to serve the Greater New Brunswick area's vulnerable communities. Rutgers Robert Johnson Medical School Homeless & Indigent Population Health Outreach Project-Promise Clinic (HIPHOP-Promise Clinic) medical students, faculty, and staff continue to provide, through an ongoing pandemic, a comprehensive clinic that provides high-quality primary care to the medically underserved clients of Elijah's Promise Community Kitchen. The partnership of the medical school community and Elijah's Promise under the direction of medical school faculty has built, maintained, and modified an environment patients can rely on for all their medical needs. Elijah's Promise Community Kitchen

Recipients of Elijah's Promise Community Kitchen services are eligible, and actively recruited, for care at the Promise Clinic. Elijah's Promise is a dynamic organization that helps low-income individuals by providing nutritious meals, a broad range of social services, culinary arts training, and health screenings. Elijah's Promise has been a wonderful partner and advocate for the community. Students staff a booth at the community kitchen twice a week to provide blood pressure screenings. Our student-doctors also provide health education for the members of the community through teaching sessions. Our partnership with Elijah's Promise enables community members to engage in health maintenance activities and to monitor their health weekly.





Operations:

- Oversee all Promise Clinic activities as clinic directors, managers, schedulers, and first-year representatives
- Act as liaisons between steering committees, student-doctors, preceptors, faculty advisors, and clinic staff
- Manage the flow of clinic weekly and collaborate to realize long-term goals for Promise Clinic



Social Needs:

- Collaborate with the Rutgers School of Social Work and student-doctors to identify patients' social needs, including housing insecurity, food insecurity, and unmet educational needs
- Work with community partners to connect patients with local resources to alleviate these pressures with the goal of improving overall health and wellness

Community Outreach:



- Collaborate with Elijah's Promise Community Kitchen, other community-based partners, and other steering committees to facilitate patient recruitment and ensure patient follow-up
- Coordinate bi-weekly screening efforts at Elijah's Promise Community Kitchen and work to improve the health of the population by developing public health education materials and programs
- Organize clinic-wide interventions to target prevalent diseases by administering and analyzing the annual Patient Demographic Survey and encourage student-doctors to practice preventative medicine

Lab:



- Manage all lab testing during clinic hours, including blood draws, urine samples, finger stick glucose, and other lab procedures
- Collaborate with the Middlesex County Department of Health to provide mammography, pap smear, and colon cancer screening for patients through the CEED (Cancer Education and Early Detection) Program





Specialty Care:

- Work to increase the breadth of specialized medical resources available to Promise
 Clinic patients and to streamline the process of obtaining care
- Provide student-doctor teams with specialists' contact information and assist with the Charity Care program onsite



Communications:

- Manage contact with all Promise Clinic patients, including Spanish-speaking patients
- Keep in touch with patients regarding appointments and outpatient care, and work closely with clinic schedulers to arrange new patient appointments and follow-up appointments
- Serve as interpreters for Spanish-speaking patients and recruit others to serve as interpreters through a Student Interpreter Program



Pharmacy:

- Provide patients with prescriptions and vouchers to obtain medication from a local pharmacy at no cost to the patient
- Provide onsite assistance to student-doctor teams in reviewing patient medications for potential drug interactions and side effects
- Guide teams in getting their patients into appropriate Patient Assistance Programs (PAPs)



Quality Improvement:

- Identify and target areas where patient safety at the greatest risk, which includes overall clinic administration and specific team practices
- Improve the efficiency and production of Promise Clinic by using data from studentdoctor visits to implement Best Practices
- Serve as a central source of information for many Promise Clinic projects




Education:

- Make the Promise Clinic a model learning experience for student-doctors
- Maintain student attendance records for patient appointments and teaching sessions
- Act as a liaison between the steering committees and medical school staff regarding student completion of requirements



Fundraising & Finance

- Manage the clinic budget and monitor fundraising income and expenses
- Coordinate fundraising efforts within the community with the goal to reach financial sustainability and continue providing patients with free healthcare





Reflections from a Steering Committee Member

Jacob Jaslove has served on the Community Outreach Steering Committee of Promise Clinic for the past 8 years as a student in the RWJ MD/PhD program. The following is a reflection on his experiences:

"Can you take my blood pressure?" I heard a familiar voice saying. It was a typical Wednesday night at the Elijah's Promise Community Soup Kitchen in New Brunswick, Promise Clinic's longtime community partner. As a member of our Community Outreach committee, I visited Elijah's Promise monthly along with first year student doctors to take blood pressures, talk to clients about health topics, and to recruit patients to Promise Clinic. It was one of my favorite people at Elijah's Promise who had asked to have her blood pressure taken, a client I had seen almost every month for the five years I'd been going to Elijah's Promise. Every time we checked, her blood pressure was excellent at just about 120/80 but she liked checking it every time, just to be sure.

At Elijah's Promise, clients will ask our visiting student doctors questions about their health like "what does it mean if someone has diabetes," but often clients just want to talk about what is going on in their lives. Taking blood pressures and recruiting patients for Promise



Clinic are what we do at Elijah's Promise, but our real mission there is to build relationships with our community.

We recruit all our patients at Promise Clinic through Elijah's Promise and so every first- and second-year student doctor visits the community soup kitchen at least once. Being able to interact with all individuals regardless of their backgrounds in an empathetic and understanding way is a critical skill for a healthcare provider. Although we endeavor to provide needed services to our EP community, we gain much more than we can ever give when the community helps us sharpen this skill.

As in all relationships, our relationship with our community changes over time. During the COVID-19 pandemic, Elijah's Promise adapted to implement safety protocols and we adapted with it. Our committee chairs worked tirelessly to find new ways to keep serving our EP community: setting up to take blood pressures outside of EP instead of inside and even meeting the EP food distribution van at a local church to give out vouchers for free fresh fruits and vegetables through our partnership with the New Brunswick Community Farmer's Market.

Throughout my years with Promise Clinic and even through the uncertainties of the last two years the themes of the clinic have remained the same: Promise Clinic is about health, and at the core of health is building strong connections and relationships from clinic to community and from person to person.

- > Foster excellence in student-doctor education

- > Increase academic research presentations regionally and nationally
