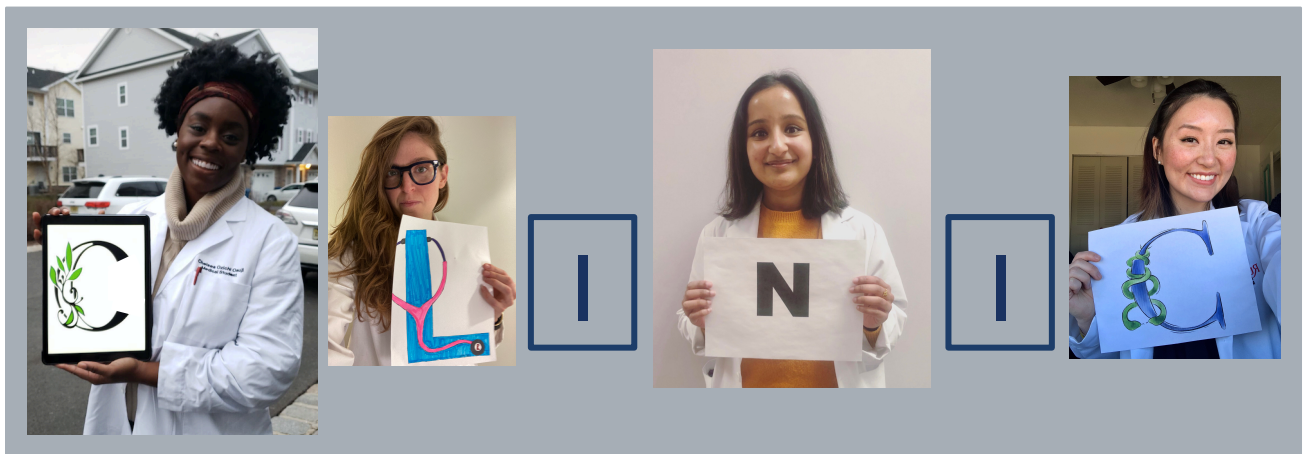


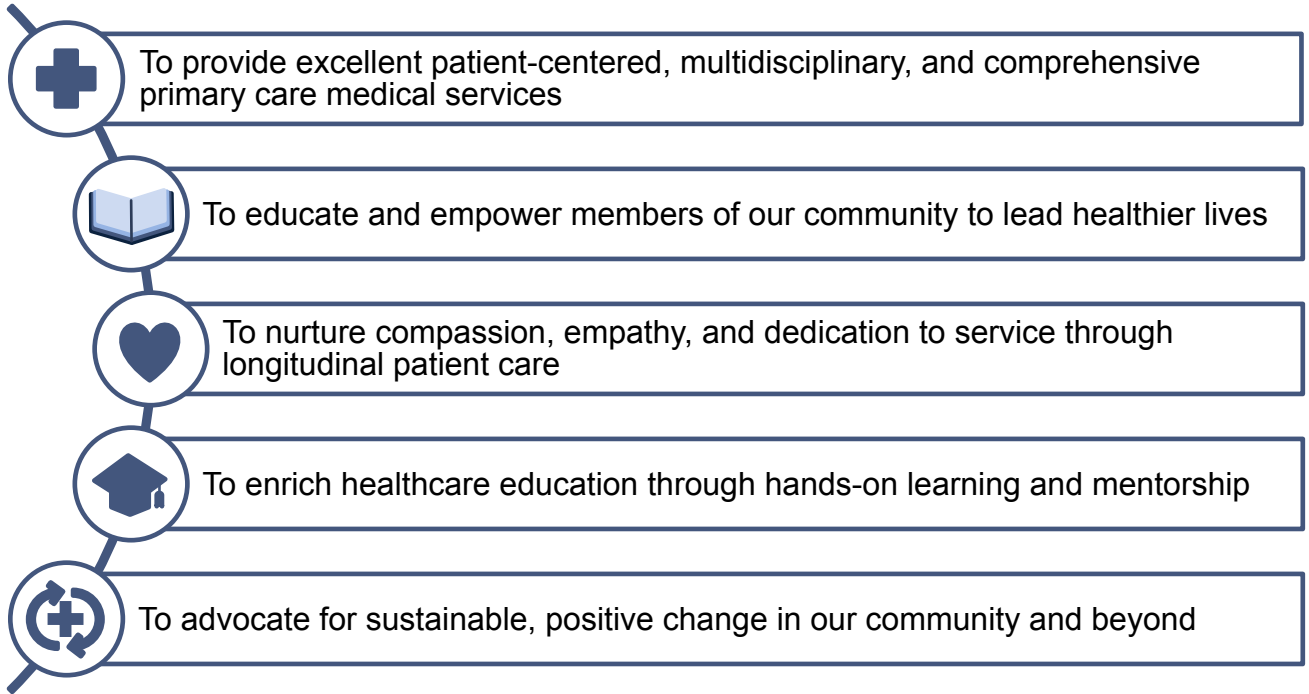
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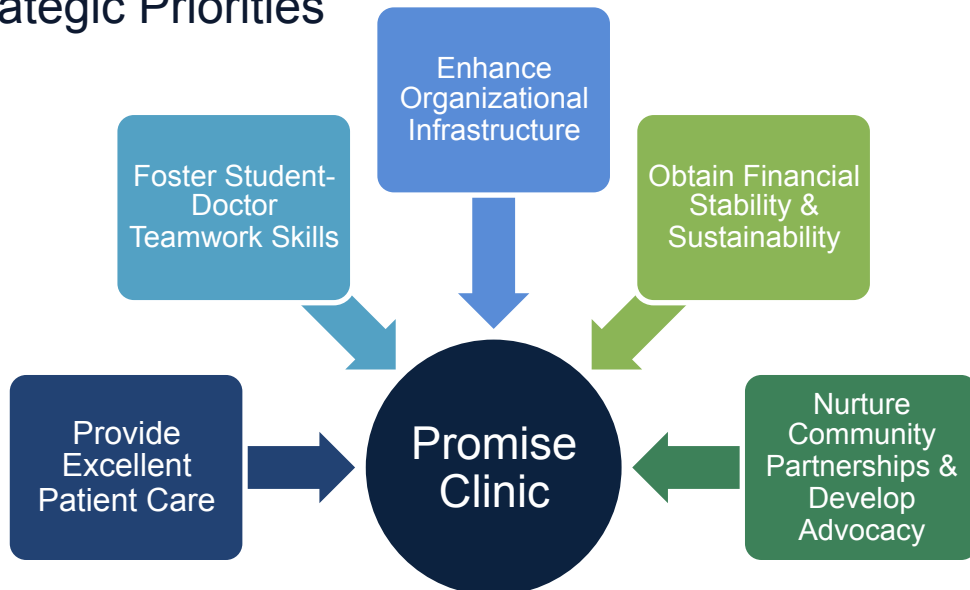

Who We Are:

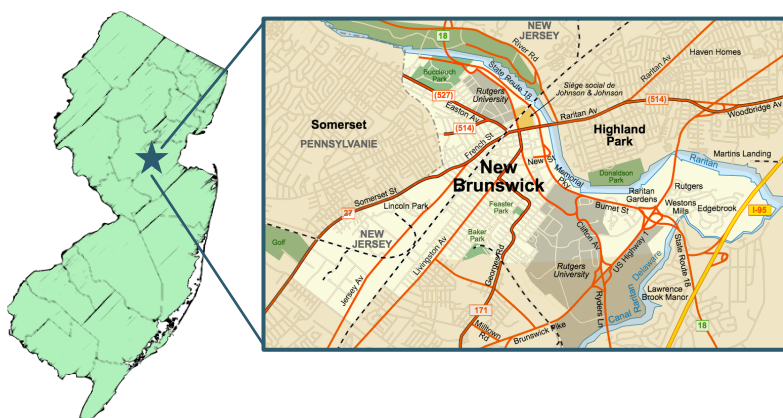
- *We are* Promise Clinic, a student-run free clinic that aims to provide free primary care to the uninsured clients of Elijah's Promise Community Kitchen in New Brunswick, NJ.
- *We are* a community of medical students, volunteer physicians, and local partners dedicated to providing patient-centered, quality primary care services.
- *We are* a source of accessible healthcare for our patients and a place for student-doctors to learn from and give back to the local community.

What We Do:

- EDUCATION AND EMPOWERMENT of clients of Elijah's Promise Community Kitchen to lead healthier lives through health literacy initiatives
- COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT through service-learning aimed at teaching future physicians the importance of continuity of care, teamwork, advocacy, innovation, and leadership
- PATIENT AND PEER EDUCATION through collaborative learning and exchange between students at different stages of their medical school education

Our Model:

- Continuity of Care
 - Each new patient at Promise Clinic is paired with a team of medical students. Under the direct supervision of volunteer clinical faculty from Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson Medical School, student-doctor teams are responsible for their assigned patient's care throughout their time in medical school, ensuring continuity.
- Team-Based Care
 - Students of medicine, pharmacy, and social work team up to provide holistic care for their patients.

Elijah's Promise Community Kitchen

Recipients of Elijah's Promise Community Kitchen services are eligible, and actively recruited, for care at the Promise Clinic. Elijah's Promise is a dynamic organization that helps low-income individuals by providing nutritious meals, a broad range of social services, culinary arts training, and health screenings. Elijah's Promise has been a wonderful partner and advocate for the community. Students staff a booth at the community kitchen twice a week to provide blood pressure screenings. Our student-doctors also provide health education for the members of the community through teaching sessions. Our partnership with Elijah's Promise enables community members to engage in health maintenance activities and to monitor their health weekly.

COVID brought many challenges to our community, but the students and faculty worked tirelessly to ensure that Promise Clinic was open to patients throughout the pandemic. Promise Clinic transitioned to a **virtual/hybrid clinic model** that allowed patients to safely access medical care. **Team-paired interpreters** eased healthcare delivery for our Spanish-speaking patients. **Health Passports** empowered patients to actively engage in improving their health. **VeggieRx** encouraged patients to incorporate healthy produce into their diet. Student-driven initiatives offered creative and compassionate solutions to care for patients through **grocery deliveries, mobile hygiene stations, mask distribution, and food donation.**

Student Initiatives and Highlights



eVoucher system:

Pharmacy created an online voucher system for patients to pick up prescriptions at the pharmacy.

DBSA Mental Health Check-ins:

Student-doctors began incorporating mental health screenings and check-ins during appointments.

Hemoccult Testing:

Lab implemented a plan to provide colorectal cancer screening for patients over 50.



Structural Racism in Medicine:

Education developed a new teaching session for student-doctors that explicitly addressed structural racism in medicine.

Promise Clinic Publishes:

“While states have been diligent about reporting positive cases and deaths, there is an unreported statistic: the number of underserved individuals who were not able to access the information and care that they required. During the last six months, Promise Clinic was able to mitigate the effects that this pandemic might have otherwise had on the New Brunswick community, reducing the size of that statistic.”

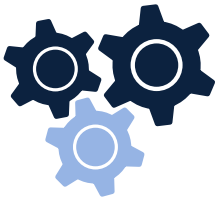

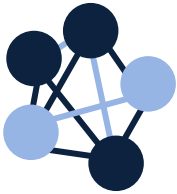


Promise Clinic Subcommittees



Operations:

- Oversee all Promise Clinic activities as clinic directors, managers, schedulers, and first-year representatives
- Act as liaisons between steering committees, student-doctors, preceptors, faculty advisors, and clinic staff
- Manage the flow of clinic weekly and collaborate to realize long-term goals for Promise Clinic



Social Needs:

- Collaborate with the Rutgers School of Social Work and student-doctors to identify patients' social needs, including housing insecurity, food insecurity, and unmet educational needs
- Work with community partners to connect patients with local resources to alleviate these pressures with the goal of improving overall health and wellness

Community Outreach:



- Collaborate with Elijah's Promise Community Kitchen, other community-based partners, and other steering committees to facilitate patient recruitment and ensure patient follow-up
- Coordinate bi-weekly screening efforts at Elijah's Promise Community Kitchen and work to improve the health of the population by developing public health education materials and programs
- Organize clinic-wide interventions to target prevalent diseases by administering and analyzing the annual Patient Demographic Survey and encourage student-doctors to practice preventative medicine

Lab:



- Manage all lab testing during clinic hours, including blood draws, urine samples, finger stick glucose, and other lab procedures
- Collaborate with the Middlesex County Department of Health to provide mammography, pap smear, and colon cancer screening for patients through the CEED (Cancer Education and Early Detection) Program



Specialty Care:

- Work to increase the breadth of specialized medical resources available to Promise Clinic patients and to streamline the process of obtaining care
- Provide student-doctor teams with specialists' contact information and assist with the Charity Care program onsite



Communications:

- Manage contact with all Promise Clinic patients, including Spanish-speaking patients
- Keep in touch with patients regarding appointments and outpatient care, and work closely with clinic schedulers to arrange new patient appointments and follow-up appointments
- Serve as interpreters for Spanish-speaking patients and recruit others to serve as interpreters through a Student Interpreter Program



Pharmacy:

- Provide patients with prescriptions and vouchers to obtain medication from a local pharmacy at no cost to the patient
- Provide onsite assistance to student-doctor teams in reviewing patient medications for potential drug interactions and side effects
- Guide teams in getting their patients into appropriate Patient Assistance Programs (PAPs)



Quality Improvement:

- Identify and target areas where patient safety at the greatest risk, which includes overall clinic administration and specific team practices
- Improve the efficiency and production of Promise Clinic by using data from student-doctor visits to implement Best Practices
- Serve as a central source of information for many Promise Clinic projects



Education:

- Make the Promise Clinic a model learning experience for student-doctors
- Maintain student attendance records for patient appointments and teaching sessions
- Act as a liaison between the steering committees and medical school staff regarding student completion of requirements



Fundraising & Finance

- Manage the clinic budget and monitor fundraising income and expenses
- Coordinate fundraising efforts within the community with the goal to reach financial sustainability and continue providing patients with free healthcare

Reflections from a Student-Doctor

Ila Nimgaonkar served as a student-doctor and steering committee member at Promise Clinic for the past seven years as an MD/PhD student. She has been a student director for the past four years. The following is a reflection on her experience:

The patient was shabbily dressed, tired, and carrying seven loaded grocery bags with all her possessions, which weighed down each labored step as she approached us. Her Promise Clinic student doctor, dressed in a neat business casual outfit and ironed white coat, greeted her with a smile. It gave me a rush of pride, as the M2 Scheduler running clinic that night, to see the professional care and respect given to our patient.

That evening, our patient tearfully shared with us that she lived in a two-bedroom apartment with seven others and slept on the kitchen floor, always on the brink of being evicted. We enrolled her in the PATH program, a local transitional housing service, with the help of a social worker. Though medicine cannot solve every problem, we have the education and status to navigate a confusing world of resources for our patients. And even when our attempts to help our patients fail, the simple act of dressing in our nice clothes to listen to a patient cry about her living situation conveys that the world has not forsaken her.

This is truer than ever in 2020; a year that has been stressful, demanding, uncertain, and isolating. COVID-19 swept through New Brunswick early during the pandemic, disproportionately affecting minority and low-income populations. We rapidly transitioned our care services to a virtual and phone-based format; a herculean task that required intense coordination between our faculty, student volunteers, and community partners at Elijah's Promise. Several of our patients contracted COVID-19, and their student doctor teams rose to the double challenge of navigating the management of a poorly understood and devastating disease, while also figuring out how to do so entirely virtually.

Medical, social, and psychological wellness are the threads that weave the fabric of patient care at Promise Clinic. To this end, when SARS-CoV-2 descended on our city, our students delivered groceries to patients' homes, performed wellness check-in calls, and called hospitals to coordinate discharge plans. Dr. Lin personally met patients in the clinic to dispense critical medications. The tenacity, compassion, and ingenuity of our volunteers gave me the same rush of pride I felt as an M2. I thank all our members for facing the challenges of 2020 with strength and courage, and most of all for keeping Promise Clinic operational for our patients. May we continue, with the same ingenuity and enthusiasm I have seen in each of my years at Promise Clinic, to provide our patients with compassionate, holistic care and lessen the weight they carry through our doors.
